SECRETARY'S ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2009-2010

Mr President,

Honourable Chief Guest, District Governor Nominee Rtn Dr. Yogesh Verma, Incoming President Rtn. Mukesh Changia, Incoming Secretary Rtn. Naveen Soni, Guests of Rotary, Rotary Annes and Rotarylets, Interactors, Members of RCC, and fellow Rotarians.

The Rotary Club of Kalimpong has just completed its seventeenth year and is now moving on to its eighteenth. I consider it a great honour that I have had the opportunity to serve in this Club as Club Secretary 2009 -2010. It has been a good opportunity for learning while working with President Rtn. Kamal Bajla. He was a marathon runner and a Tae-kwon-do exponent, and proved the ability to endure and improvise with generous humour and equanimity, intermittent political disturbances that threw the club's programmes out of gear, natural disasters and bureaucratic red-tapism and inefficiency that deprived victims of Rotary relief aids, and insanely busy members perpetually out of station! My second term as Secretary of the club has been very enjoyable, and I have learnt all over again what it means to be a part of one of the best Clubs in the Rotary District 3240.

I present before you my report of the Rotary Club of Kalimpong for the year 2009-2010, with a note that we have functioned through the traditional four avenues of service – Club Service, Vocational Service, Community Service and International Service, but have also incorporated and implemented Rotary's Club Leadership Plan that builds up a more grounded leadership line-up. We will incorporate Rotary's projected fifth avenue of service —Youth Service – in the next term.

1. I shall begin with **CLUB SERVICE**, the Cornerstone of Rotary which maintains the health and vigour of the Club.

6th July, 2009 – After assuming office the President reached out to the community with his first public

relations programme by participating in the Tree Plantation Programme organized by the Pragati Yuva Sangh and Milan Yuva Sangh at Dalman Gaon. He was accompanied by Rtns Dhendup Lama Yonzone and Rtn. Deo Prakash Pandey.

13th July, 2009 – The President and Secretary participated in another public relations programme by garlanding the bust of Poet Bhanubhakta at the Trikone Park on the occasion of Bhanu Jayanti.

23rd July, 2009 – Saplings were planted around the Rotary Centre by the President and members of the Club.

27th July, 2009– The President and Secretary offered khadas at the Martyrs Memorial Monument at the Shahid Park, 11th Mile, on Martyrs' Day.

29th August , 2009 — August being the Membership Development Month, the Club hosted the District Membership Seminar at the Himalayan Hotel. PDG Rtn. Manoj Desai held the audience spellbound with his Keynote Address. The Interactions and debate were lively and fruitful. There was outstanding attendance of 155 members from 20 Clubs across the District. The Seminar was an eye-opener and motivational for many Rotarians. PDG Rtn. Kirti Ranjan Dey wrote to the President: "*...I must confess that in my 33 years of Rotary experience, the Kalimpong seminar on Membership Development was the best.*"

8th August, 2009 – Club service organized the 17th Installation Ceremony at Himalayan Hotel. President Rtn. Kamal Bajla and his board took over the reins of the Club formally. The Installation was delayed due to political disturbances.

15th August, 2009 – The President hoisted the National Flag at the Rotary Centre, and represented the Club during the Independence Day Celebrations at the Mela Ground.

6th September, 2009 – PP Rtn. Indira Bose, Director, club Service, and Club First Lady R'Anne Aarti Bajla, organized a special Get-together for the Rotary Annes of the Club as a mark of appreciation for their continued support to Rotary and Rotarians.

1st November – PE Rtn. Mukesh Changia attended the District Polio seminar at Gangtok.

19th November, 2009 – The Nominating Committee announced the incoming Board for 2010-2011.

6th December, 2009 – In the Rotary Family Month of December, the RC Kalimpong Family enjoyed a traditional family picnic at Tapoban with Rotarians enthusiastically cooking the delicious lunch. It was a memorable day of fellowship fun and games for all.

Mention may also be made that the Rotarians were highly pleased over the 'tongba-get-together' which generated waves of nostalgia among them for good old days gone by.

21st January, 2010 – Rtn. Sumit Jindal presented a talk on Rotary Awareness with specific reference to the work done by RC Kalimpong. He encouraged members to give, give, and give, in true Rotary spirit.

24th January, 2010 – Nine members from the Club attended the Inter City Meet organized by the Rotary club of Gangtok at Rangpo. Secretary Anukampa Subba won the prize for Best Debater in the debate organized for the meet.

13th – 14th February, 2010 – The President and Rtn. Alvin Lama attended the District Conference at Imphal

26th – 28th, February, 2010 – PE Rtn. Mukesh Changia and AGE PP Rtn Prakash Gupta attended the PETS in Barapani, Shillong.

23rd February—World Understanding and Peace day was celebrated with a potluck dinner.

3rd- 4th April, 2010 – A team of enthusiastic members attended the District Assembly and DTTS at Gangtok where they presented an exemplary mock Club-Assembly which was appreciated by everyone present there.

20th April, 2010 – The Club's Charter Night was celebrated at the Rotary Centre. Charter members were felicitated, and all of them shared their experience of being in Rotary, and offered suggestions on making the Club even more vibrant, enjoyable and effective.

12th June, 2010 – The Club celebrated Annes' Night at the Rotary Center. A memorable Night of fun, games, love and laughter, it brought the Rotary Kalimpong Family closer than ever before in a befitting get-together to close the Rotary year 2009-2010. Besides these events, Club Service made sure that all Regular Meetings, the twelve Board Meetings and two Special board Meetings, and six Club Assemblies were conducted smoothly and in time. We have gained two new members, Rtn. Bibeth Sharma and Rtn. Alvin Lama. But sadly, we also lost one member, Mr. T.B.Lama through resignation from the Club on personal grounds. We have had several visiting Rotarians to share ideas with us and bring projects into fruition. Only four issues of Sudarshan, the club Bulletin, could be published this year. One issue of the Sudarshan was digital. The average of membership attendance for the year is 52 % which is a cause for concern.

PP Rtn. Indira Bose, Director, Club Service, walked three extra miles to make Club Programmes

successful. Rtn. Karma Tenzing Sherpa and Rtn. Rakesh Sinhal worked hard at various activities under "Project Come Together" to improve the attendance of the Club and beautify the Rotary Centre. Rotarians are now contributing money to construct the wall behind the Rotary Centre.

2. Let me move on to **VOCATIONAL SERVICE**, the Soul of Rotary which fosters and supports the ideal of service.

19th September, 2009 – September being the New Generation Month, a Power-Point Presentation Competition was held for the Schools of Kalimpong on "Promoting Kalimpong as a Tourist Destination". Nine schools participated in the event.

29th October, 2009 – The District Governor paid his official visit to the Club. Along with the Club inspection, he sought to rally support for Rotary's fight for eradication of Polio. The DG'S Visit was teamed with the Club's yearly programme of presenting Vocational Excellence Awards to citizens of Kalimpong. This year's Vocational Excellence Awards were presented to Mr. Narendra Tamang of Kalimpong TV for outstanding contribution to Audio-visual Journalism, and to Mr. Chinlop Fudong Lepcha for outstanding contribution to Photography and Photojournalism.

3. On to **COMMUNITY SERVICE**, the Heart of Rotary that encourages and fosters the ideal of service to the personal, business and community life of every Rotarian.

This year Community Service was the avenue hardest hit by political disturbance and uncertainty.

12th July, 2009 — Community Service began with the cleaning of the Trikone Park for Bhanu Jayanti.

Installation Ceremonies of the Interact Clubs and Rotaract Club, our Partners in Service: 11th August, 2009 for Saptashri Gyanpeeth; 19th August, 2009 for St. Augustine's School; 24th August, 2009 for St. Joseph's Convent; 1st September, 2009 for the Rotaract Club of GSIHM; 2nd September 2009 for Dr. Graham's Homes; 6th September, 2009, for RCC Bhagey Sangsey; and 26th September, 2009 for Rockvale Academy. Besides these, we also participated in the "razzmatazz" food festival fundraiser put up by the Rotaractors in 31st October-1st November 2009, and the 2nd Interact Dance Competition held on 31st October, 2009.

7th November, 2009 – Cancernirvana in Association with Rotary Club of Kalimpong formally launched the CD on Cancer Awareness in a befitting ceremony held at the town Hall. Dr. Pankaj Choudhury from the North Bengal Oncology Center gave an illuminating talk on Cancer, and Mrs. Rajani Tshering reached

out to the audience with her experience of winning her personal battle against Cancer.

25th January, 2010 –Trikone Park was cleaned for the Republic Day.

RC Kalimpong, as usual, takes the Polio Eradication Drive very seriously. This year we had three Polio NIDs on the 10th of January, 2010, and 7th February, 2010. The average number of children immunized every NID ranges from 2500 to 2800.

9th May, 2010 – A Poster Contest on tobacco Awareness organized by the North Bengal Oncology Centre was conducted for schoolchildren by Cancernirvana in association with Rotary Club of Kalimpong at the St. Augustine's School Hall. 163 students from 13 schools participated in the programme. The winners from the Contest could not participate in the Final Contest held on World No Tobacco Day (31st May) at the North Bengal University Auditorium due to their exams.

18th May, 2010 – Rotarians participated in the Disability Screening and Identification Camp organized by the BDO's Office at Nimbong, and distributed the much needed old clothes to the poverty stricken villagers there. The Club is seriously thinking of making this an ongoing activity of the Club.

6th June, 2010 – A three-pronged programme was organized by the Club at Bhagey Sangsey. Under the ongoing Mother & Child Nutrition Programme, 139 packets of powder food supplement made from five types of roasted grains were distributed along with the recipe and dosage card. This was supplemented by a talk on Cancer in Women by Dr. Gyalmit Lepcha, and another talk on Alcohol and Drug Abuse by Mr. Rupesh Chhetri, Counselor and Centre-in-Charge of the Himalayan Anti Aids and Narcotic Drugs Society (HANDS).

The livelihood programme of distributing fruit saplings, vegetable seeds and piglets is still on track. This year RC Kalimpong, DISHA, and the Indigenous Lepcha Tribal Development Foundation have supported a project for training rural women to manufacture local handloom goods and handicrafts. RC Kalimpong has sponsored Rs. 3600/- as remuneration for the trainer.

This year the club has also sponsored school fees for five children from Dalman Gaon. Their stationary was sponsored by the Interactors and Rotaractors.

Rtn. Navin Soni has firmly placed Cancernirvana on the map of Cancer Care activities in India. He has even promoted it in Pattaya, Thailand.

The planned activities that could not be implemented were programmes for Rotaract and Interact weeks, the Zonal Interact RYLA, Walkathon, Health and Vet

Camps. The biggest disappointment was in not being able to give Rotary ShelterBoxes to victims of Aila because of bureaucratic complications. However, our partners in service, the Rotaractors of GSIHM were able to reach out to the victims in remote villages of Kalimpong with food, clothes, utensils and other essential supplies worth Rs. 40,000/- from the funds that they had raised.

4. And finally, **INTERNATIONAL SERVICE**, the Vision of Rotary. The purpose of International Service is the advancement of International Understanding, goodwill and peace through a world of fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

10th October, 2009 – IPP Rtn. Prakash Gupta attended the TRF Seminar in Shillong and came back with detailed information on Rotary's Future Vision Plan on Humanitarian Grants for Future Vision Pilot Districts.

15th November, 2009 – Five members from the Club attended The Rotary Foundation Seminar at Burdwan and contributed US\$ 1400 to the Annual Giving Fund.

19th November, 2009 – PP Rtn. Ganesh Mani Pradhan gave a talk on Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation.

23rd February, 2007 – International Service and Club Service jointly organized the World Understanding and Peace Day celebration at the Rotary Centre. PP Rtn. A.N. Sood gave a talk to the gathering on World Understanding and Peace.

20th - 22nd June, 2010 – IPP Rtn. Prakash Gupta and PP Rtn. A.P Lal have represented our Club at the RI Convention in Montreal, Canada.

PHF – We have contributed to the Rotary Foundation for two PHF awards this year. Rtn. Tim MacDonald will receive his lapel pin today, on the day of the 18th Installation. Rtn. Catherine Samling will receive hers as soon as it reaches from Rotary Foundation (India), New Delhi.

Contribution for Polio Fund – The Club has been able to contribute Rs. 18,800/- to the District Polio Fund from the sale of Polio Coupons.

GSE —This year we were able to field candidates both for Team Leader (IPP Rtn. Prakash Gupta) and Team Member (Miss Norbu Dolma) for the Group Study Exchange Programme to Dist.1930, Germany. They faced the District Level Interviews but were not selected for the programme. However, they came back with valuable experiences to share.

Sankhamani Pradhan Memorial Rotary Digital Library – This year we have finally managed to get the FCRA Prior Permission to build the Sankhamani Memorial Rotary Digital Library at the Rotary Centre with the money donated by Dr. Khem Pradhan Fatimi, daughter of the late Mr. Sankhamani Pradhan. The Library is meant for the underprivileged students and scholars of our society. After clearing the formalities, we are now in the process of receiving the first installment of US\$ 5000 for the construction of the library. The total plan is for US\$ 25,000.

As far as **Matching Grants** are concerned, we have good news! After months of networking and hard work, our proposal for the Kalimpong College Water Harvesting Project is now registered with the RI as a Pilot Project for Global Grants for the next Rotary Year. Our friends from the Rotary Club of Kelso which funded the RMPS Project, took interest in our proposal, convinced five other clubs of their District and their District to pool in their resources for this Project. So now we are looking forward to working with six clubs under Dist.1020 Scotland, on a Project worth US\$ 32,500 (about Rs.15 lacs) to provide water for Kalimpong College which has a total strength of 2200 students and 100 staff members. This Project is slated to be the only Global Grants Pilot Project for the District 3240 for 2010-2011. Two Future Vision Pilot Districts will now take the Rotary vision and goodwill to the future.

Rotary Club of Geringong, Australia, has sent an additional AU\$ 1000 for the Sishu Shiksha Kendra at Samsing, and the project for furnishing the school is in the process to be continued in the next year.

Rotary Club of Kensington, Australia, and others are showing interest in doing Matching Grants Projects with us. We are in the process of brainstorming for viable projects to meet the real needs of our community.

The Rotary Foundation Standing Committee of our Club deserves the credit for their tenacity and their public relations and persuasive skills in getting good work done.

So the Future of Rotary is being transferred from the hands of the current President and his Board and entrusted into the hands of the incoming President and his Board. President (2010-2011) Rtn. Mukesh Changia and his Board will surely have their hands, minds and hearts full of Rotary!

I wish the Incoming President and his Board a very fruitful and successful term as they go about Building Communities and Bridging Continents in the year to come!
